Dear Sjögren's Patient:

Are you between the ages of 18 and 75 and suffer from Sjögren's syndrome in the absence of other rheumatic conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis or lupus? If so, I am excited to inform you of a Sjögren's clinical trial that is ongoing at a medical center in your area. The investigational medication being researched looks to target the underlying causes of Sjögren's rather than just relieving the symptoms.

Sjögren's is characterized by sicca symptoms such as dry eyes and dry mouth which you may have to deal with every day. However, the disease may also cause other, more widespread symptoms such as skin rash, joint and/or muscle pain, and salivary gland or lymph node swelling.

There is no cure for Sjögren's. Current medications available are designed to relieve the symptoms of disease. You can help change this. The involvement of Sjögren's sufferers, like yourself, in these trials is critical in order to uncover breakthroughs that will help Sjögren's patients worldwide.
